National and State Updates-Ben Moser

Ben gave the following updates for Day 12 of the National Emergency from the following media sources: The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Los Angeles Times, and The Boston Globe:

- New York virus attack rate is five times more than that anywhere in the United States
- Federal lawmakers closer to a deal with a two trillion-dollar relief package
- China to lift lockdown on April 8, 2020
- Governor of California needs 30,000 more hospital beds
- Governor of Massachusetts issued a stay at home advisory. All non-essential businesses to close by noon today
- Governor of Georgia orders all bars and night clubs closed and gatherings of 10 or more stopped for the next two weeks
- Georgia Income Tax deadline moved from April 15, 2020 to July 15, 2020 to align with the federal deadline
- Governor of Alabama also extended the state filing deadline to July 15, 2020
